Christopher Prendergast visits the campus of UCSB October 17th-21st as the Graduate Center for Literary Research's Distinguished Visiting Professor. Prendergast is Emeritus Professor at the University of Cambridge and a Fellow of King's College. He was formerly Distinguished Professor in French and Comparative Literature at the Graduate Centre, City University of New York. He is a member of the British Academy, the Academia Europea and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. He is also Honorary Professor at the University of Copenhagen.
